When you were little, did you have a little strange friend? One that had a funny color and shape or could hide in your pocket? Did you have a friend that was totally imaginary?

If you did, you are one of the most people. People used to believe that imaginary friends are not usual, but one study in the US found that almost two-thirds of seven-year-olds had an imaginary friend at some point. Another study in the UK on the group of 1,800 children showed that 46% of them had an imaginary friend now or in the past, even 9% of 12-year-olds!

While parents might be worried to hear their children talking to themselves, imaginary friends don't appear to be bad at all. As a matter of fact, some studies show that having imaginary friends helps children develop speaking and social skills. These social skills can help children make more real friends. Imaginary friends help children practice social situations, like standing up to bullies or show difficult feelings. They also give children a chance, for once, to tell someone else what to do.

Imaginary friends aren't **a red flag** at all. In fact, they appear to be very positive importance. Perhaps parents will start hoping their children spend a few years talking to thin air.

We live in a world full of all the colors of the rainbow. However, some people are given up the pleasure of seeing them because they are color-blind. With common color blindness, people are not able to take some colors in, but totally color-blind people can see only shades of black, white and gray.

The condition is seldom seen, about one in every 40,000 people. Those who are affected are easily sensitive to bright light, so they often wear sunglasses when going out. Their everyday lives also become difficult because of the poor eyesight, especially when cooking, as they cannot tell whether meat is cooked or not.

However, being totally color-blind isn't totally a bad and sad thing. Color-blind people all have excellent night vision because they often wear sunglasses to block the light. Also, people who are totally color-blind may have very good memories. This is because, not being able to be sure of their eyes, they have a greater need to remember things when they were taught for the first time. Besides, to make up for poorer vision, their other senses, such as hearing and smell, may be sharper. These highly grown senses may make them great watchers of everything around them.

Although totally color-blind people are not able to see color as we know it, their world can still be "colorful" in its own special way.

July 22

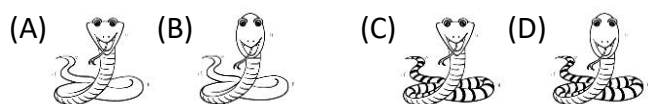
After lunch at an amazing restaurant, I left Rinari at 14:00.
