CAPYBARA

Capybaras are the biggest rodents in the world. They live in South America, near rivers and lakes. Capybaras have brown or gray fur, short legs, and webbed feet, which help them swim well. They can be up to 1.2 meters long and weigh up to 66 kilograms. Capybaras eat plants, grasses, and fruits. They need to stay near water to keep cool and for social activities. Capybaras are very social animals and live in groups. They make a lot of noise to communicate with each other. They often interact with other animals too.



GUINEA PIG

Guinea pigs are not pigs but much more like mice. They are also rodents. Guinea pigs come from the Andes mountains in South America. They live in highlands and grasslands. Guinea pigs are small and have round bodies with different colors of fur. They are about 25 to 30 centimeters long and weigh about 0.7 to 1.2 kilograms. Guinea pigs eat grasses and vegetables. They need a lot of fiber and Vitamin C to stay healthy. Guinea pigs are gentle and often kept as pets. They can live in groups but are sometimes kept alone. Unlike capybaras, guinea pigs do not need to live near water and prefer dry places. They often use burrows or nests of other animals to live in.



Traffic lights help us stay safe on the roads. The first traffic light was invented by J.P. Knight in London in 1868. It used gas lamps to show red and green lights and was controlled by a policeman on a call. After an accident and a policeman got hurt badly, the traffic light was moved away.

In 1912, an American policeman named Lester Wire made the first electric traffic light. It was installed in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1914. Over time, traffic lights improved. In the 1920s, William Potts added yellow lights to warn drivers that the light would soon turn red.

In the 1950s, East Germany introduced the "green man" traffic light for pedestrians. This "green man" shows people when to cross the street safely. Taiwan followed this idea and made the walking green man in 1999. The green man looks like he is walking. When the green light is about to turn red, the green man starts walking faster. This helps people cross the street safely. Taiwan also added a countdown timer to show how much time is left to cross.

Traffic lights use three colors: red, yellow, and green. Red means stop, yellow means be careful, and green means go. These colors were chosen because they are easy to see. Red light has the longest wavelength, so it can be seen from far away. Green light is also easy to see.
